
How can you help, you ask?




#### **Hey Moose Heyyyy**



All of these awards are now on display in the case in the entryway. Take a look at them and be proud of what your Anchorage Moose Lodge accomplished this past year!



# Making hot cocoa in a crock pot is easy and perfect for gatherings! Here's a simple recipe:

1 cup cocoa powder

1 cup sugar (adjust to taste)

- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 6 cups milk (I mix 4c milk and 2c cream)
  - 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
  - \* Optional toppings: whipped cream, marshmallows, chocolate shavings, peppermint sticks \*
- 1. Mix Dry Ingredients: In a bowl, combine the cocoa powder, sugar, and salt.
- 2. Add to Crock Pot: Pour the dry mixture into the crock pot.
- 3. Add Milk: Gradually whisk in the milk to prevent clumps. Stir well.
- Heat: Cover and cook on low for about
   hours, stirring occasionally. If you're in a hurry, you can cook it on high for about
   hour, but keep an eye on it to prevent burning.
- 5. Add Vanilla: Once heated through, stir in the vanilla extract.
- 6. Serve: Ladle into mugs and add your favorite toppings!
- \* For extra flavor, you can add a pinch of cinnamon or a splash of peppermint extract \*
- Adjust the sweetness by adding more or less sugar based on your preference.





#### Chocolate Covered Candy Cane Marshmallows

You'll need candy canes, marshmallows, melting chocolate and decorations/sprinkles of your choice.

Dip the candy cane in a bit of melted chocolate, slide into marshmallow. Let sit for a minute, then dip the marshmallow into the chocolate to cover.

Cool, decorate and enjoy! Excellent with hot cocoa.
